

Go, sell what you own, then follow me.

Mark 10.17-30

You've heard the expression, "How hard can that be?" We usually employ it to point out the obvious ease or simplicity of some task. But in today's Gospel, Jesus shocks his disciples by saying--not once but twice--how hard it is for the rich to enter the Kingdom of God. "How hard can that be?" Impossible, Jesus declares, without God's help.

Our culture looks up to and encourages us to become like those with wealth and power. We at least want to have enough of the worlds' goods to ensure security for our families, and to provide for the future in an uncertain world. And yet there's an element of the Kingdom that pushes us to consider the alternative.

Today's Gospel recommends, even urges, divesting ourselves of goods and attachments for the sake of God. To take the risk of letting go--of seeking alternatives to possessing more and more--in a society that promotes "conspicuous consumption", that is indeed an impossible task without God's help.

I can't begin to spell out what such alternatives might mean in your particular case--I confess to having enough trouble living up to my own religious vow of a simple and unattached life! But I do take heart in Jesus' assurance that God wants to work with us to explore the possibilities! That brings the Kingdom a little closer for me when I hear these Scriptures.

Safe Parish and Community Diocesan Protocol

To provide ministry in our parish or the diocese, volunteers must meet requirements depending upon frequency and risk level of position or ministry. Those who volunteer regularly must satisfy the requirements of the risk level pertaining to their ministry or service and all sign a "Safe Parish & Community Pledge". If the ministry/service is categorized as high risk, also have a Criminal Record Check is to be completed.

These must be renewed every five years. Please call the parish office to renew or sign a form.

<u>Statement of Apology to Indigenous People of this Land from the Catholic Bishops of Canada:</u>

On the 24th of September the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a statement of apology to the indigenous peoples. The bishops affirmed and acknowledged to the Indigenous Peoples, the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools as well as the historical and ongoing trauma faced by the Indigenous. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools, the Catholic Bishops of Canada expressed their profound remorse and apologized unequivocally.

Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, the Bishops pledged to undertake fundraising nationwide to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. They also committed to continue to the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves.

A delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in December 2021 and discern with Pope Francis how best to proceed together on the pathway of hope and renewal in the coming years.

The Bishops of Canada are committed to continue the journey of healing and reconciliation with the First Nations, Metis and Inuit Peoples of this land. For more information, please contact the diocese or visit www.cccb.ca

The active promotional phase of Called Together 2021-22 is complete. The the overall diocesan goal of \$200,000 is at 37.54% totalling \$75,071. To date \$51,831 has been collected. Please keep those donations coming in.

This year, as last year, the majority of our funds are allocated to support the smaller parishes and missions of the diocese, as they have significant obstacles due to COVID.

Concurrently funds for the B.C. Bishops' appeal in support of healing and reconciliation are also being collected.
