Today's Gospel story is a favorite of mine. It's a parable about forgiveness, but what I like is Peter's question to Christ before the parable. You remember the question I'm sure: "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus of course, goes on to reply, "not seven times but seventy-seven times."

Father Raymond Brown, the late American Scripture scholar, once commented on this exchange between Peter and Jesus. He observed that we perhaps are quick to criticize Peter for his stinginess in forgiving. What, only seven times, Peter?

Father Brown suggests that we all must examine our conscience. How often would you or I forgive an offense from the same person? I know that I would take all the pleasure and all the credit I could get from graciously forgiving that first offense. And when my brother offended me a second time, I sure would lay it on thick as I grudgingly forgave a second time.

But would I even entertain a third request for forgiveness? By then I suspect I wouldn't even be *speaking* to my brother! Instead, I'd be telling everyone else how injured I was by such an ungrateful person–whom I've deigned to forgive twice before!

And what's that Jesus? Did you really say 77 times?

This year the focus of the appeal, **Called Together**, has changed in order to support to those areas of the Diocese that require the most assistance to withstand the effects of the pandemic. Many of the smaller parishes typically receive assistance

from Catholic Missions in Canada. Due to reduced contributions, Catholic Missions in Canada are unable to support the parishes as generously. To help with this shortfall, a priority for funds raised from this year's appeal will be to support smaller parishes.

Assistance will also be given to maintain the camps and to provide support for a reduced youth and young adults program.

Reduced amounts will go to our Catholic Schools, Outreach and Evangelization from the remaining balance.

The goal total goal for the Diocese is \$200,000.
