The crowds asked, "What should we do?".

A friend of mine refers to Advent as a season of "joyful expectation." Older Catholics remember this



Third Sunday as "Gaudete Sunday" from the Latin word for *joy.* In times past and today rosecolored vestments were worn in church.

Our First and Second Readings carry the theme of joy, but then the *Gospel* is all business. John the Baptist is dispensing advice to various groups who come to see him. The *Gospel* names two of them: tax collectors and soldiers. John advises them to carry out their daily duties with justice.

I suppose that if those two professions in Jesus' time made a radical change in their way of doing business, it would be a cause for joy! Tax collectors were universally despised, and soldiers represented the might of the Roman occupation.

Luke wants to show us that change was in the air. The coming of Jesus would transform all human life. That was good news indeed. What would bring us joy today? An end to terrorists' threats? Conversion in the corporate world from greed and personal gain? A new spirit of generosity and service in people's everyday lives?

Paul urges the Philippians to be joyful because "God is near." That very presence of God ought to be our focus, because that would help us with the other things that need changing. From Father Greg Friedman, OFM

Covid Restrictions

We are allowed to have in-person Mass as per Northern Health Medical Officer and the <u>PHO</u>. In order to do this, we must comply with: (<u>SECTION F- Pages 17 & 18</u>) which states:

1. All people over the age of 11 who attend worship services are required to show proof of vaccination.

2. All must have face coverings- officiants and participants except when reading, leading, or taking part in ritual (i.e. receiving communion)

a. A face covering must be worn in a manner that covers the nose and mouth.


4. Comply with the maximum 50% capacity. IC is 150 people the church and 200 people in the hall

IC will:

- 1. Have Livestream available for the vulnerable and the unvaccinated.
- 2. Distribution of communion
 - a. In the church foyer once the church has been vacated for 10 minutes after Mass has ended.

We ask that those wanting to receive communion be at the church before 15 min prior to the hour. i.e. 9:00 AM Mass–arrive by 9:45AM

The expiry date on this current order is January 31, 2022.
