Each Sunday at Mass in my parish, I honor the *Gospel* book by holding it high before the assembly and carrying it slowly to the ambo--the place where I proclaim the *Gospel*.

In our First Reading today we witness a

similar scene. Ezra the priest opens the scroll of God's law and holds it high for all to see. The people acclaim God present in the Word of God, as they bow low to the ground.

The presence of God in the Word is one of three ways God is present at each Eucharist. We are most familiar with the divine presence in the consecrated bread and wine. God is also present in the gathered assembly. There we're transformed by the Holy Spirit into the Body of Christ, described by Paul in today's Second Reading.

But back to the First Reading: Do we pay attention to God's presence in the Word? Would it be easier if we were in that scene in today's *Gospel*, to hear Jesus himself read the scroll of Isaiah in the synagogue at Nazareth? Perhaps it's tougher to accept God's presence when it's Jim or Mary or Father Bill doing the reading! But our respect for the *Gospel* book, our attentive listening, our openness to the Spirit, are all crucial to full participation in the Eucharist. Let's allow this Sunday's readings to call us to a renewed response.

### **Updated Covid Restrictions**

Thursday January 20, 2022 Northern Health removed the regional health restrictions. Provincial Health restrictions will be followed.

<u>The following is taken from provincial</u> <u>COVID-19 restrictions –</u>

### Worship services

### If all participants are vaccinated as

determined by the worship service leader, there are no capacity restrictions on worship services and choirs.

If participants <u>are not all vaccinated</u>, worship services and choirs are limited to **50% seated capacity.** 

### A Mask /Face Covering is <u>REQUIRED</u>

- We will follow the 50% capacity; that is 150 people in the church and 150 in the hall.
- For those who do not want/are unable to wear masks distribution of communion will be available in the church foyer after Mass for those wishing to watch virtually. Please come at quarter to the hour. ie. 9:45AM, 11:45 AM Ministers will be available for 10 minutes after Mass.
- We will continue to livestream for the time being at 11:00AM Sunday morning and Monday to Friday at 9:00AM

The 2022 envelopes are available for pick up in the church foyer. If you don't see your envelope, please ask Fr. Chris or Martha.

Note there are fewer full envelope packages the year. Those who had #211 or higher have been assigned a new number. Please add your name and address for the first few donations to ensure that the amounts are recorded for the correct person.

Those who use the pre-authorized debits have been provided with only the special collections envelopes, also available in the foyer.
