THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. While it expresses the deep longing of all humanity for God, it



celebrates the three-fold coming of the Lord: remembering the events that surrounded the Lord's coming long ago, celebrating his coming among us today, and looking forward to his final coming in glory.

Its four Sundays highlight our desire and longing for peace, justice and unity. Advent begins the Sunday falling on or closest to the 30th of November and ends Christmas Eve.

The first part of Advent looks forward to the *parousia*, the Lord's glorious return at the end of time and reflects on his presence among us today.

The second part of Advent – from December 17^{th} to 24^{th} – is a direct preparation for Christmas, the yearly commemoration of Jesus' coming among us in human flesh. Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation

ASPECTS OF ADVENT

Colour: Violet is used for the priest's vestments and for altar clothes. Rather than penance the use of violet in Advent reflects longing and anticipation. Rose vestments may be used on the third Sunday (*Gaudete Sunday* or *Rejoice Sunday*) to signal the mid-point of the season.

Liturgy: *The Glory to God* is not sung to make clear that the Advent Season is one of anticipation and preparation for the full joy and glory of Christmas.

Flowers too may be used, but in moderation to leave a sense of abundance for the celebration of the Nativity.


Advent Wreath: Although originally used in home prayer, the wreath has found a place in the Advent décor of churches. Its evergreen circle and four candles symbolize: the eternal love of God; Christ, who is our Light; and the weekly passage of the Advent Season. It is often blessed on the First Sunday of Advent.
