Flowing from the Year of St. Joseph declared by Pope Francis, and inspired by his apostolic letter *Patris Corde*, comes our new Pilgrim Icon Program in honor of St. Joseph.



The "just man," whom God chose to protect, defend and raise the most precious of his gifts to

humanity had not a word of his own recorded in Scripture. Tradition tells us that our Lord's foster father died – likely with Jesus and Mary at his side – even prior to Jesus beginning his public ministry.

St. Joseph carried out his mission of raising, guarding and preparing Christ quietly, courageously and faithfully. For that faithful work, St. Joseph was rewarded – not with seeing the fruits of his labor in this life, but with the incomparable prize of glory in heaven.

Since 1979, the K of C Pilgrim Icon Program has held more than 174,800 local council and parish prayer services with some 22 million participants.

Our parish will have a prayer service on March 1, 2023 after the daily 9:00AM Mass to honor St. Joseph.

WHAT DO WE DO DURING LENT?

Lent is a time when we are invited to carry out a three-fold mission, with the key pillars being <u>fasting</u>, almsgiving, and <u>prayer</u>. Certainly, these components are not new within our Catholic teachings nor are they reserved only for Lent, as we are encouraged to practice them regularly

throughout the year. However, a special and renewed focus on each of them during Lent can foster growth and appreciation within our collective faith and respective spiritual journeys.

Fasting: As Jesus fasted in the desert for forty days, we, too, are called to forgo something for the same period when observing Lent. It is during this time that we can deepen our awareness of his sacrifice on the Cross, as well as Jesus' daily forgiveness of our sins and unconditional love for us.

Almsgiving: Stressing the importance of recognizing those in need while demonstrating the model of selflessness that Jesus embodied on earth, Lent offers us an opportunity to further concentrate on acts of charity within our communities through the giving of time, money, clothing or food, or any volunteer service.

Prayer: Another avenue for self-growth during Lent that can lead us into a closer relationship with God is prayer.
