The blessing of animals is a Catholic custom that is centuries old, and one that is conducted in remembrance of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals. St. Francis was known for his love of animals and for all of God's creation. He even wrote a lyrical poem titled, *Canticle of the Creatures*.

an ode to God's living creatures and all of creation. The blessing of animals, therefore, is often, by custom, held on or near October 4th, the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. The blessing of animals celebrates the companionship and service of pets and livestock, the beauty of God's creation, and our gratitude and concern for all of God's divine handiwork.

In keeping with this centuries-old tradition, we will have a blessing of pets on Saturday, October 7, 2023, at 1:00 p.m. Pet owners are invited to bring their pets to this ritual blessing. Please form a circle or oval in the lower school field (section inside the fenced area closest to Cathedral Avenue) when you arrive.

For safety and organizational reasons, pets must be on a leash or in a carrying device. Should your pet need to use the field for 'washrooming' purposes, please ensure that you remove any 'deposits' from the field as children use it for play and sports activities.

WHAT IS A SYNOD?

"Synod" comes from the Greek words *syn* and *hodosj* ("together" and "path"), meaning to walk together the path of our Lord. Traditionally, this sense of walking together the path of our Lord in a synodal process has been linked with the image of the two disciples walking with the Lord on the road to Emmaus as He opened their minds, hearts, and souls to the meaning of the Divine Word and enlightened them to his very Presence in the Breaking of the Bread.



Synods in the Catholic Church have generally featured an assembly of bishops who come together to assist the Holy Father in addressing the issues, concerns, and needs of the Church of a particular time. Such gatherings of bishops with the Holy Father can be traced back to the early centuries of the Church. With his 1965 *motu proprio (edict)* titled, *Apostolica Sollicitudo*, St. Pope Paul VI emphasized the importance of the synodal process by establishing the formal practice of such gatherings under the term, *Synod of Bishops*.

While synods have typically focused on the gathering of bishops with the Holy Father for matters of discernment (as described above), Pope Francis has inaugurated the present Synod of Bishops with an instruction that *the entire People of God* (bishops, lay men and women, religious, and priests) participate in the process of discernment; a discernment which is to involve a listening to the Word of God in scripture, an attentiveness to the wisdom of the lived Tradition of the Church, and a listening to one another, especially those at the margins, that we might together, as Church, discern the signs of the times.

The Vademecum for the Synod (September 7, 2021) says this about the Synod:

"[...] the whole Synodal Process aims at fostering a lived experience of discernment, participation, and co-responsibility, where a diversity of gifts is brought together for the Church's mission in the world.

In this sense, it is clear that the purpose of this Synod is not to produce more documents. Rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission (*PD*, 32). Thus the objective of this Synodal Process is not only a series of exercises that start and stop, but rather a journey of growing authentically towards the communion and mission that God calls the Church to live out in the third millennium.

This journey together will call on us to renew our mentalities and our ecclesial structures in order to live out God's call for the Church amid the present signs of the times. Listening to the entire People of God will help the Church to make pastoral decisions that correspond as closely as possible to God's will (ITC, *Syn.*, 68) The ultimate perspective to orient this synodal path of the Church is to serve the dialogue of God with humanity (DV, 2) and to journey together the kingdom of God (cf. LG, 9; RM, 20). In the end, this Synodal Process seeks to move towards a Church that is more fruitfully at the service of the coming of the kingdom of heaven.

Let us, the People of God, ask for the paternal protection of our Eternal Father, the love and teaching of the Divine Son, and the wisdom of their Spirit over the Synod in Rome that it may inspire and inform us about the ways that we are called to journey forward as Church.
