REPEAL SECTION 43 OF THE CANADIAN CRIMINAL CODE

Section 43 of the Criminal Code currently states: "Every schoolteacher or person standing in place of a parent is justified in using force by way of correction toward a pupil or child, as the case may be, who is under his care, if force does not exceed what is reasonable under the circumstances. R.S.C., 1985, c. C-4" NDP Member of Parliament has tabled a Private Member's Bill (C-273) in the House of Commons calling for a repeal of this section of the Criminal Code of Canada. The bill is now scheduled for a vote in the House in January 2024. It is therefore imperative that those who would like to see the repeal of Section 43 write to their MP to urge him/her to pass this bill to outlaw the physical punishment of children in Canada.


DIOCESE OF VICTORIA PASTORAL CARE TRAINING SESSIONS – WINTER 2024

Statement of CCCB on Vatican's Document Addressing Pastoral Blessings

On Tuesday, December 19, 2023, the CCCB released a statement regarding the recent publishing of Fiducia Supplicans from the Vatican. In the statement, Bishop William McGrattan, president of the CCCB, says: "While explicitly affirming the Church's traditional understanding of marriage, Fiducia Supplicans allows pastors to bless people who freely request a blessing, seeking divine help to live in fidelity to God's will. The Declaration makes clear that such blessings must be directed to the persons themselves rather than their situation and that they must be spontaneously requested and are not ritual or liturgical actions."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter into the celebration of the Christmas Season, we turn our gaze to the little town of Bethlehem, whose name in Hebrew means, "house of bread" or "house of food".



How appropriate! For within a stable in that little town of Bethlehem, the Christ Child was born: a Child, both human and divine, who became Sacred Food for us, who became the Bread of Life for us! In sacred scripture, we read: "And the Word became flesh and lived among us..." (John 1:14) And in the synodal document, The Eucharist: Source of the Life and Mission of the Church, we read: "St. Hilary maintained that "if it is true that the Word was made flesh (cf. Jn 1:14), then it is also true that in the food of the Eucharist, we receive the Word-Made-Flesh."

According to the plan of our Triune God, the Divine and Eternal Word took on our humanity in the form of an Infant Child, as One conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born from the humanity of Mary. And this Infant Child was laid in a trough with hay beneath Him: a place usually meant for animals to gather and graze. This is not happenstance. This is a necessary event (as well as divinely-directed symbolism) for the Infant Child laid on hay in a trough came to us, as Pope Francis once said, to feed "a starving humanity with his tender love."

The Divine Eternal Son came to feed us with Himself so that in taking Him (who *IS* Love, Peace, Hope, and Healing) into our very person, we might become, more and more, His spiritual Body in the world: a People called to act as effective instruments of love, peace, hope, and healing for others – both in word and action.

It is in the sacred meal and holy sacrifice of the Mass that we meet the Christ Child, our Saviour, who came to feed a starving humanity! We are hungry in many ways in our lives: hungry for regular food, yes. But hungry, too, for love, peace, hope, and healing. And in that hunger, we ultimately hunger for God.

As we celebrate the coming of the Christ Child into our lives as our Saviour and the Bread of Life, I, with the Pastoral Team (Martha, Sr. Michaela, and Fr. Matthew) offer this prayer:

May our Blessed Mother, the Immaculate Conception, watch over you and yours – just as she, St. Joseph, the Eternal Father, the Spirit, the shepherds, and the angels watched over the Son of God laid in a manger in the little town of Bethlehem. May Christ, the Bread of Life, quench our various hungers, and help us to be effective ministers of his love, peace, hope, and healing. Amen.
